We started the season playing Bromsgrove and played, I'm told, as though we hadn't played rugby together for 2 years. Despite having no regular centres with Will Robinson having a serious knee injury which will probably keep him out until Christmas, meanwhile Oli Wood managed approx. 15 mins for the season. James Dyson and Will Harrison had stepped into the breach which definitely helped, from then we went on a run of 8 games without defeat including an away win at the eventual league champions Newport (Salop) and getting us in Rugby World as Team of the Month for October. Our run ended once more at our bogey team Syston. Our next home fixture saw local rivals Sheffield arrive and leave with only a losing bonus point. The run up to Christmas was less successful and we went to Bridgnorth with a team made up of 15 of the 18 players from the pathway which also bodes well for the future.

Unfortunately we came away empty handed. A loss at home to Broadstreet and a draw at Burton saw the end of 2021.

The New Year saw a mixed return with a win at home to our other local rivals Doncaster Phoenix and a heavy defeat away to Dudley K. Revenge was then had by then league leaders Newport who were in the middle of a 15 match run undefeated. We then went away to Nuneaton and snatched defeat from the jaws of victory. We then lost to Oundle at home, fortunes then changed slightly with an away win at Paviors on a day more suited to water polo than rugby and good bonus point home wins against Sandbach & Syston. A loss away to Sheffield followed by probably the best game of the season at home against Bridgnorth, which coincided with the LKAB hospitality day, where a rare drop goal in the final minutes by the Peter Pan of Scunthorpe rugby club Tom Foster put Scunthorpe saw us take a 7 point lead into the time added on by the referee only for Bridgnorth to secure the ball from the kickoff and score a converted try. Leaving the score at 48-all. Scunthorpe then won a penalty in front of the posts for MoM Josh Clarke to convert the last kick of the game and keep his 100% record for the day and the final whistle. The league season finished with 2 high scoring defeats away at Broadstreet & home against a good Bromsgrove team. Thanks go to Simon for keeping the pitches in good order throughout the season and subsequently we missed no home games at Heslam Park.

So to the team overall. Throughout the season we used 38 players, including returns for 2 " retired" players Gareth Mist and Nick Syddall. 2 players managed the complete season these were Liam Brunt and Tom Foster who also managed to complete 500 league games for the club which by any standards is an incredible feat this doesn't include any cup or preseason games played over the years. At the end of season supper, 1st team Honours went to Josh Lugsden as top try scorer and young player of the season, Players player was Ben Hyde and the Player of the season (AKA Nobby Clarke Memorial trophy) was Tom Foster a well deserved accolade after 14 seasons as captain.

A difficult season with many fixtures for 1 reason or another and limited to only 12 games for a full season.

With Covid still looming over the country the rugby season was upon us. Preseason had gone well but some injuries were picked up across both 1st and Stags, hopefully this wouldn't impact on the season. The Stags captained by George Mason and Vice-captain Jack Rowbotham were at the helm on the pitch with Martyn Graves and Craig Kirwin running the side-lines. With the core of the Stags missing due to injury and work commitments, this would be a hard difficult season ahead.

First game of the season should have been Sandal who pulled out due to Covid issues. Not a great start. A friendly for the second weekend saw the Stags take on Selby. This would give the Stags their first chance to play rugby. A tough game which the Stags should have put to bed by half-time but Selby fought well, and the game ended 32-24 with a win for the Stags. Hull Ionians at home became the 1st league game of the season despite horrendous weather conditions, the Stags were victorious and won the game 23-10. Next away to York at the start of October the weather was far better with both sides using running rugby. The match being played at such pace with both sides displaying some good rugby skills. Only some dubious decisions had the Stags with 3 tries disallowed, meaning the game ended York victorious 24-17. Moortown drop out of the league but still honoured their away fixture. Another victory 14-7. Again, a mixed squad with S. Green, R. Goodyear, O. McNeil, K.Owen and J. Samuels stepping up from the Patriots. Storm Arwen in full force as the Stags travelled to Driffield. The Stags battled well against a physical side but came out victorious 10-0.

5 games prior to Christmas saw us win 4 and only lose one and all of December without a fixture.

Rugby started again for the Stags on the second week of January, meaning 6 weeks had passed with no rugby. A friendly match against Selby, the Stags fielded yet another mixed squad but had E. Bell, J. Goodison and S. Fisher back in the squad. The Stags won another hard-fought battle against a strong Selby side, final score 18-8.

End of January saw Sheffield travel to fortress Heslam, a strong Stags side faced the Yorkshire squad in what would be a match to forget as the visitors won 57-5. Cleckheaton at home next in weather fit for amphibians. Stags 10-0. 2 games then were played 1 home and 1 away to Hull Ionians. Having previously beaten them this season in the league, these would be some physical games. The Stags had a mixed squad again and fought well between equally matched teams, final score 18-15 to Ionians, who scored a penalty with the last kick of the game. Away to Ionians, brought again a few changes. Wet and windy conditions meant it would be up the jumper rugby again. Both sides played well, Ionians winning 5-0. Ionians' coach even stated that it was a well-balanced game and would have been happy with a draw.

Away to Sheffield- A bare squad of 15 with only C. Graves on the bench meant this would be the Stags biggest test of the season. The game kicked off with only 13 Stags on the pitch as traffic issues meant some Stags were stuck in traffic. Sheffield started strongly with 2 tries in quick succession. The Stags regrouped and showed 100% commitment and threw their bodies on the line in what was to be a dogged performance and probably the most commitment shown by the Stags all season. The Stags fought back and gained a penalty try when Sheffield's scrum was penalised. The game ended with the Stags losing 33-19, an excellent performance by the Stags despite the loss.

Last game of the season- Bridgnorth brought their second team along with their first team to play at Heslam. Bridgnorth only had brought 12 players but fortunately the Stags were able to loan them some to even up the squads. A good display of running rugby by both sides with the Stags coming out victorious 37-5. The game was played in good spirits and M. Stow played prop for Bridgnorth got the well-deserved, man of the match. The players who have been available every week deserve a medal!! It has been a tough season mentally and physically for all involved with the Stags, with only 12 matches played all season. We won 7 and lost 5, considering the core of the Stags was minimal, Patriots stepped up and some colts had to shine, not as bad a season as it could have been.

Consistency, strength in numbers and the commitment from all available players will need to be monitored and all aspects improved on. We need to rebuild to move forward, to keep the Stags at the level they are more than capable of playing at. We go again!!

We've had a very successful year. Our goal was to field a full team in every game and we managed to achieve that, most games having 2 or more subs.


Played 16 won 8 drew 1 and lost 7, finishing 4th in a very competitive league
